
THE BIGGEST JIGSAW IN THE WORLD





This **stone church** was not built here but near **Oxford Circus**, in central London, 176 years ago.


As Oxford Circus became a shopping area, there wasn't much need for a church anymore. But, **Kingsbury needed a church**. What could they do?

Each stone was numbered and laid out on the grass. It took builders 3 years to put the church back together again here. It was called 'the biggest jigsaw in the world'!














ST ANDREW'S KINGSBURY

THE SECRET ANIMALS OF ST ANDREW'S



The church is filled with lots of beautiful pieces of **furniture**, windows, and artwork.

But there are secret animals hidden everywhere...

RABBIT



The **pews** are the benches you sit on whilst in church. They were specially made for St Andrew's.

BIRD



The person who made them, many years ago, created a different animal or symbol at the end of each pew.

LION

ST ANDREW'S STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

Stained Glass is glass that has been coloured. Lots of small pieces can then be arranged into a pattern or picture. All the pieces are held together by strips of metal called lead.

Stained Glass has been used in church windows for a very long time. Many windows show important **stories** from the **Bible**. The windows are also beautiful, especially when the **sun shines** through them.

At **St Andrews's** there are **9** Stained Glass windows. Some of them are **150 years old**!

MAKE A STAINED GLASS WINDOW

INSTRUCTIONS



- Pick your window shape
- Peel off the sticky layer of the paper this will be your window
- Put a strip of black card down the middle of your sticky paper and then across the middle
- Fill the gaps of your sticky paper with tissue paper whatever colours you like!
- Holepunch a hole a the top of your window
- Tie a piece of ribbon through the hole so you can hang up your stained-glass window at home!
